Session Highlights & Themes:

As the second wave settles, we may see a larger surge of patients who have avoided seeking care. The next pandemic that we face is related to the secondary impacts of COVID – the 'shadow pandemic' of patients who have avoided or been unable to seek chronic disease care, preventive screening, etc. plus those who have been impacted by rising mental health and other challenges. We know that many clinics have also lost resources. So how will we manage the care gap?

Strategy 1: Team Approach

- If we distribute the load, we can care for patients more effectively and efficiently.
- The physician is the conductor, but the team can do a lot of the work.
- Using the team can be crucial for clinics to survive (and even thrive).

Strategy 2: Appointment Options

- Taking advantage of different appointment strategies can also help manage high volumes and provide a venue of care for those patients who are too anxious to leave home.

 Virtual strategies – phone, secure messaging and/or video – will be important now and into the future.

Strategy 3: Measurement & Monitoring

- We have data available from various sources to help us measure and monitor what is happening in our practices so that we can be responsive.
- Look to EMR panel data, TNA measures, CII/CPAR data, HQCA panel report, MD Snapshot and other sources for helpful measurement information.

Strategy 4: Panel Management

- Clinics that have maintained panel processes can accurately pull lists of vulnerable groups of patients and reach out to individuals to encourage them to make an appointment, complete lab work, get the COVID vaccine, etc.
- Some patients need reassurance about safety team can help.
