Session Highlights & Themes:

- The Proosci ADKAR model for change provides a change management structure
 - Awareness of the need for change
 - Desire to participate and support the change
 - Knowledge on how to change
 - Ability to implement desired skills and behaviours
 - o **Reinforcement** to sustain the change
- ADKAR principles can be applied for PCN initiatives, such as increasing participation in CII/CPAR

Tips from Westview PCN on CII/CPAR implementation using change management:

- Physician champions need to be knowledgeable and experienced in the area of change to lead by example
- Be prepared to address common areas of concern
- Partner with a Practice Facilitator (when possible) as they have change management skills and knowledge
- Create a team (e.g., physician champion, practice facilitator, ED, etc)
- Make signing up and adopting the change as easy as possible
- Emphasize the benefits + risks of no action
- Give regular updates
- Target innovators and early adopters to start, then early majority
- Reach out to clinics and involve clinic owners



- Meet with both physicians and clinic managers
- Provide regular updates in multiple venues
- Create some friendly competition

Practice information data, such as the information in HQCA reports, is an excellent motivator

- HQCA reports can be used for:
 - Goal creation
 - Motivating change
 - o Tracking effects of change

HQCA panel reports contain information on:

- practice characteristics
- panel characteristics
- preventive care
- chronic conditions
- pharmaceuticals
- lab utilization
- utilization
- COVID-19 vaccination data

The 2022 update includes data on COVID-19 vaccinations, and specifically identify the patients on a panel who have not received the vaccine.
